Ukarydee is a private campground that connects to the Castle Rock-Petenwell Trails with approximately 25 miles of trails with 7 loops. The campground is just off Highway 21 and County Z near Necedah, WI. The terrain is flat to slightly rolling sandy trails and mostly wooded. Some trails travel along the Wisconsin River. Shoes are not needed on this terrain. If the season is wet, there can be some small water/mud holes to cross with little difficulty.

Reservations are only made via phone to Mary or Mike Harris at 608-564-2233. However, the **NEW POLICY is that all reserved sites must be prepaid. A non-refundable two-night minimum will hold your site. From the date of your reservation, you will have one week to send a check in the mail to the address listed above.**

A registration form and campground map is on Ukarydee's website which is listed above. Click on the registration form tab. If you have trouble printing the form, right click on the registration form, hit "control C" and paste to word to print.

If you choose to come without having reservations, Ukarydee always has room for you if you are willing to picket or set up your own portable corral in the event that all 50 campsites are booked, (which is rare.)

Ukarydee has 50 spacious campsites. Each campsite provides a place to keep your horses. Forty of the sites have a 24' metal round pen. The other ten campsites have a 24' x 36' wide tape electric turnout. All campsites are designed to provide drive through parking and require little or no backing. Ukarydee also provides a large outdoor riding arena and a 60' round pen that are usually available for your convenience.

The campground is designed with three sections. Sites 2-15 are on the hill beyond the house and accommodate smaller rigs. Some larger rigs may not be able to get into these sites. Sites 1 and 16-30 are in the original field beyond the house and

barn. Sites 31-47 and A-C are in the front field on the right as you drive in and before you reach the house and barn.

Each section is equipped with modern portable toilets, tools for cleaning your campsite area, and strategically located electric hook-ups which can be reached from any site with some extra cord. Water spigots are also strategically located. A shower is available at the office for a small fee.

Most Midwest Trailgaiters book in the front section as you drive into the campground: Sites 31-47. Some sites are already reserved in the front section for our Trailgaiter weekend. So it is recommended that you reserve as soon as possible. The sites in the original field are close to the front section and are convenient for overflow.

Be aware that some areas are used for public hunting. Spring Turkey hunting is open during this time. You may encounter turkey hunters just off the trails, but we are not aware of any problems in the past. ATVs do ride on the roads, but normally there is very little traffic from them. ATVs are not allowed on the horse trails. It has been our experience that they are very considerate with approach and speed.

Make your reservation asap by phone to the Ukarydee office as sites fill up fast at this time of year. They will try to keep our club members together, so mention you are with TrailGaiters. For driving directions and more information about Ukarydee, visit their website and/or contact us.
